


ANCIENT INLAY

Spotted: a mother-of-pearl mosaic of worshippers approaching a goddess, made some 5,000 years ago (!) in the Syrian city of Mari.

960 A.D. ASIA'S INFLUENCE

By 960, Chinese craftsmen were inlaying lacquer with mother-of-pearl, such as in this 17th-century chest. (Chinoiserie fan Coco Chanel owned 32 screens that were similarly lacquered.)



ON THE BUTTON

In the U.S., entire town economies sprung up around mother-of-pearl button manufacturing, thanks to mussels from the Mississippi River.
